Message from our Anti-Bullying Team

In recent weeks' alarm has been raised and much attention given to the concerns regarding the safety of children and young people in their online activities. While seeking to teach safe use of their social media sites and to protect our children and young people from "stranger danger", the greatest risk to young people online is not from strangers but from each other. In your conversations with your children it is important to impress on them that there can be unintended or unforeseen consequences to their decisions to upload video/audio footage or to post comments, about peers or classmates, to others within their own contact group. Once uploaded or posted, these items are now outside their control. While they might know that the item will disappear within a short space of time, they cannot know whether screen shots have been taken, or if their comment has been passed on. They could, for example, be providing material that could be used to target the person identified in their post for unwanted attention or bullying. In these cases, the original sender has triggered the bullying.

We urge you to encourage your children to put themselves in the place of the person who is at the centre of their message – to see the world through the eyes of the other. How would they feel if this message/video was sent about them?
